Suicide is the <u>third</u> leading cause of death among teenagers.

97% of boys and 83% of girls have been exposed to internet pornography to varying degrees.

According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), Asian-American teenage girls have the highest rate of depression of any other racial, ethnic or gender group.


