Source / Authority on what was taught resides with the Twelve Apostles (cf Luke 24:27)



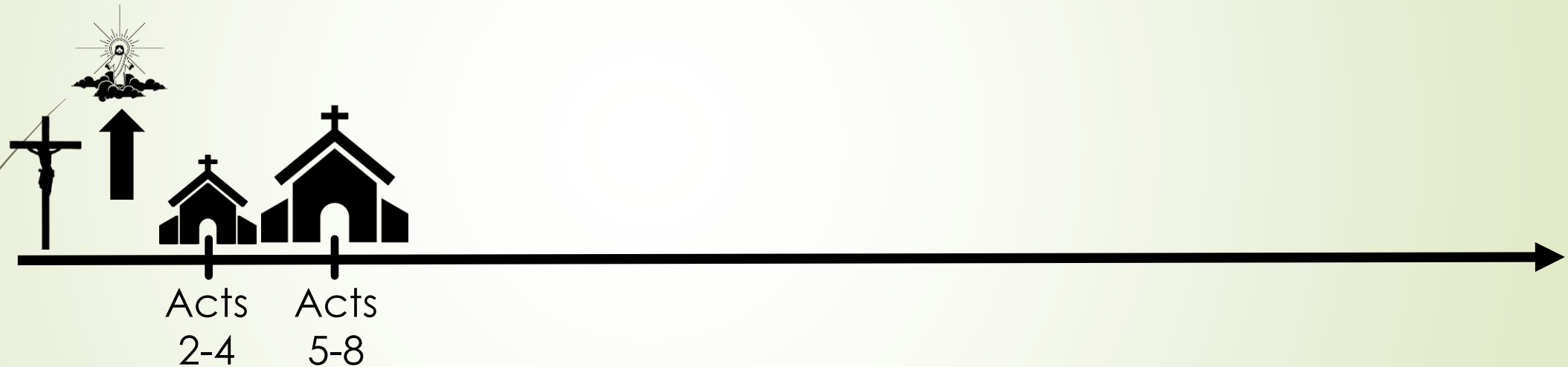
And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

Event: Jerusalem Church Grows

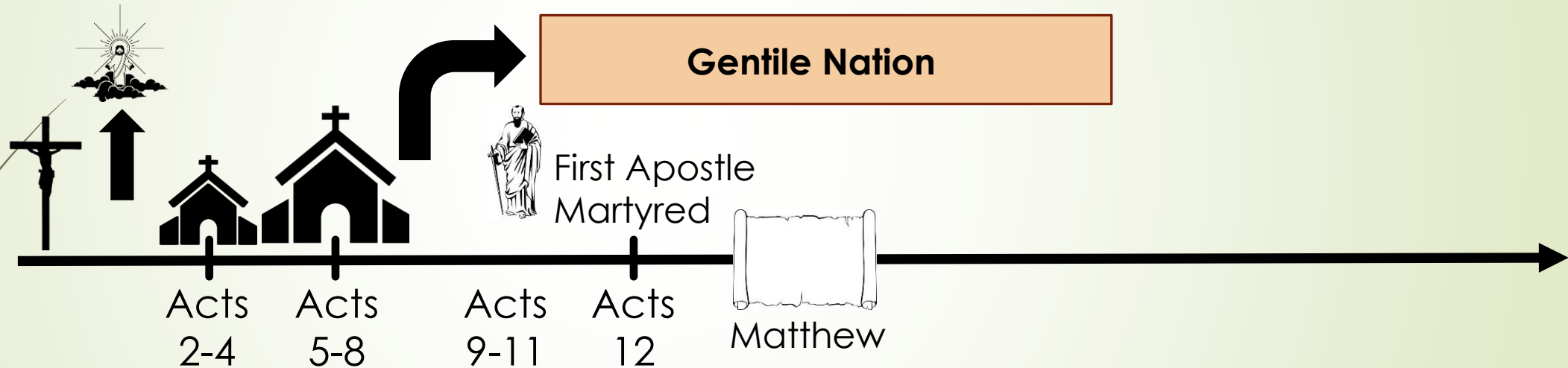


The Apostles recognized the need to unify and consolidate their teaching about Jesus

Manifesto composed by Matthew was used as source document by those who took the message beyond Jerusalem (cf Acts 8:4)



**Those who had been scattered preached the word
wherever they went**

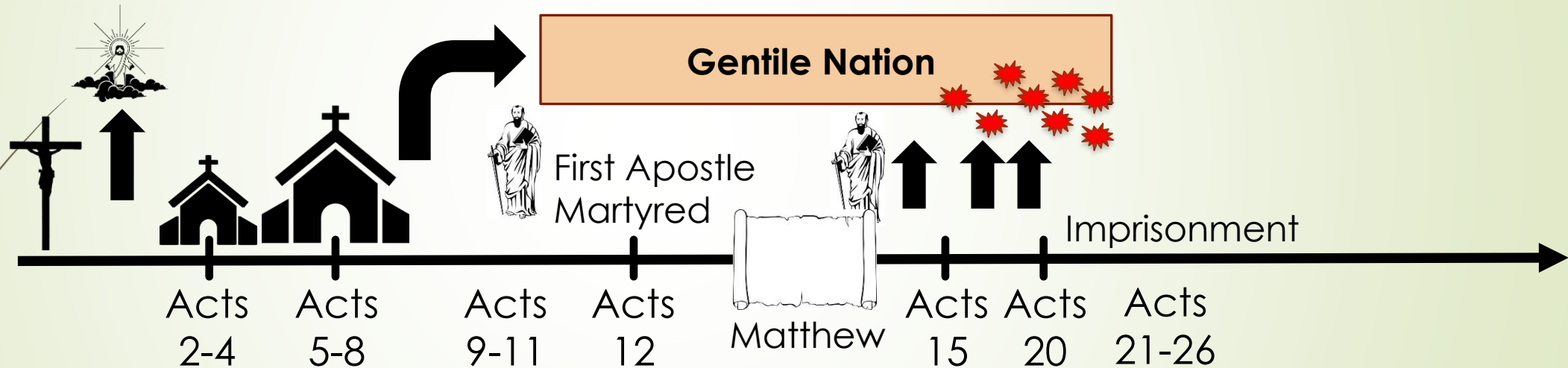
What Happened to the Twelve Apostles?

- James (brother of John) martyred in Jerusalem (Acts 12:2)
- Philip went to Phrygia through Samaria, martyred in Hierapolis
- Bartholomew went towards Asia, martyred in Armenia
- Thomas left for India, stabbed to death while church planting
- James Son of Alphaeus went to Persia, martyred there.
- Matthew left towards Ethiopia, martyred by the sword
- Andrew left for Greece, martyred on a cross after severe torture
- Peter's ministry is to the Jews, stayed in Jerusalem, later martyred in Rome
- John Son of Zebedee faced martyrdom, but survived. Only apostle to die peacefully.
- Thaddeus and Simon the Zealot – unknown / unable to confirm.

Event: Ministry to the Gentiles

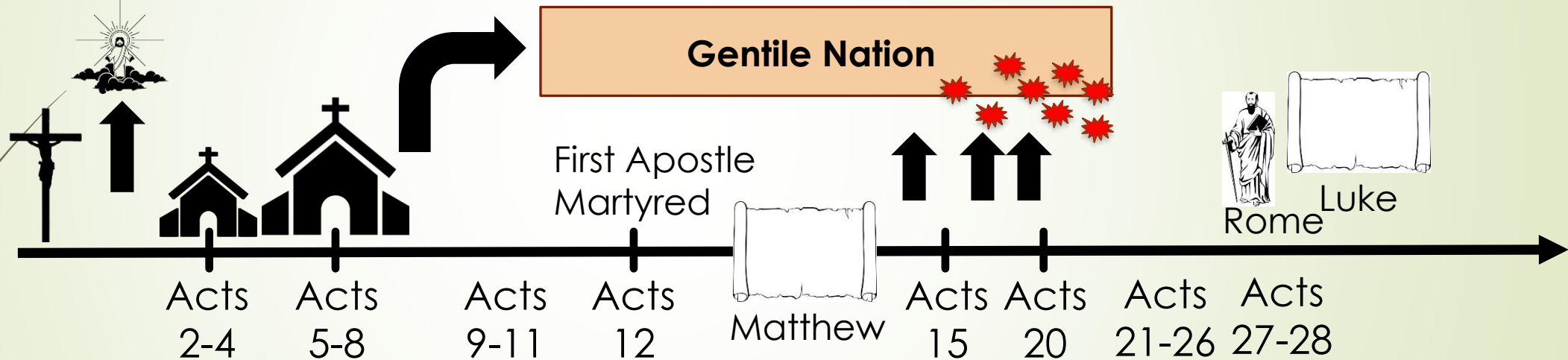


The Need for a Gentile Companion to the manifesto by Matthew was needed for the Gentile Churches Planted by Paul (cf Acts 15)

Event: Validating the Manifesto by Luke

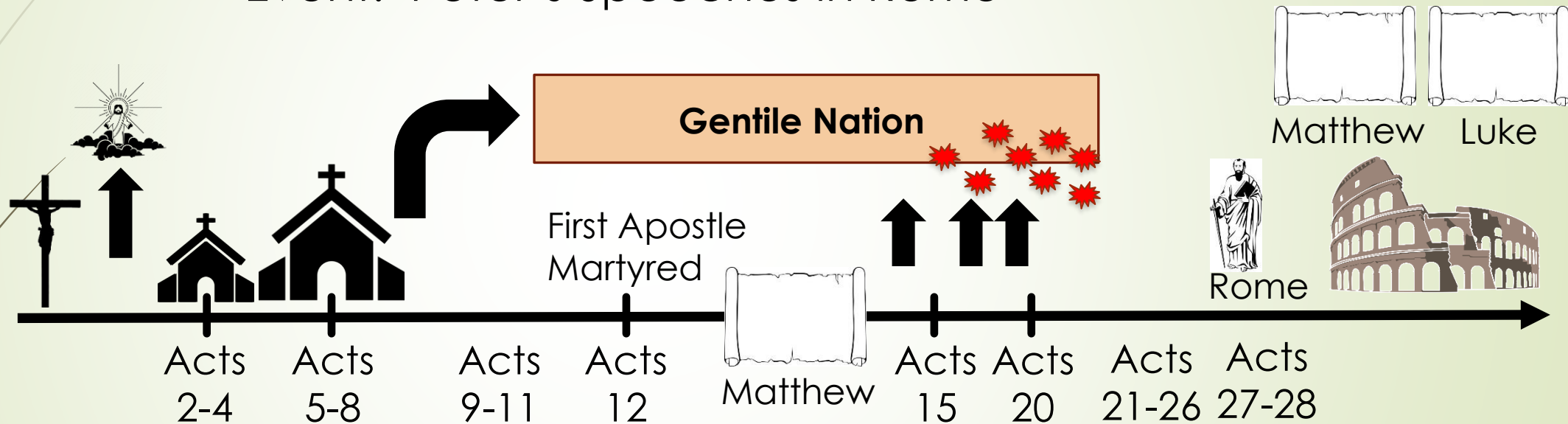


Luke's Manifesto needed endorsement by Peter and Jerusalem Church Leaders (cf Acts 11/15)

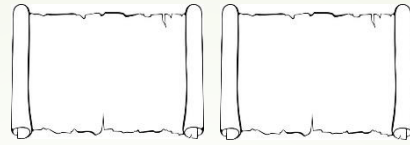

Event: Peter's Speeches in Rome

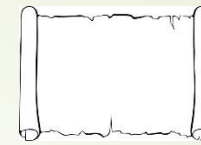


Peter gave multiple speeches to the Roman audience about the life of Christ using Both the manifesto from Matthew and Luke.

The Life of Jesus Christ in Five Parts:

- Beginning of Ministry (Mark 1:2-3:19 = Matthew 3:1-5:1 = Luke 3:1-6:19)
- Early Galilean Ministry (Mark 3:20-6:13 = Matthew 5:2-13:58 = Luke 6:20-9:6)
- Later Galilean Ministry (Mark 6:14-10:1 = Matthew 14:1-18:35 = Luke 9:7-50)
- Post-Galilean Ministry (Mark 10:2-13:37 = Matthew 19:1-25:46 = Luke 9:51-21:38)
- Passion Narrative (Mark 14:1-16:8 = Matthew 26:1-28:20 = Luke 22:1-24:53)
